

| Option Code | Option Name | Option Definition |
|-------------|------------------------|--|
| 2P | 12 Passenger Seating | Available only on Vans. A seating configuration that allows up to 12 passengers to be seated. |
| 5P | 15 Passenger Seating | Available only on Vans. A seating configuration that allows up to 15 passengers to be seated. |
| W2 | 20" or Larger Wheels | A wheel in which the diameter measures 20" or larger. |
| S3 | 3 Speed Transmission | A manual transmission with 3 forward gears. Gear shifter with pattern for 3 positions on shift knob. This has a clutch pedal in addition to the brake and gas pedals. |
| 3S | 3rd Row Seat | Rear Seats that fold, flip forward/backward or can be removed completely to provide more cargo room. Notes: If the 3rd row seats are Power, refer to Power Third Seat. If the 3rd row seats are retractable, refer to Retractable Seats. |
| S4 | 4 Speed Transmission | A manual transmission with 4 forward gears. Gear shifter with pattern for 4 positions on shift knob. This has a clutch pedal in addition to the brake and gas pedals. |
| 4W | 4 Wheel Drive | A drivetrain assembly called a transfer case that distributes power to both front and rear axles while driving. May have a button, switch or gear shifter on console with 2- or 4-wheel directional pattern or can be controlled automatically. |
| DB | 4-Wheel Disc Brakes | A type of brake system that utilizes a circular steel disc and a caliper at each wheel to stop the vehicle. |
| S5 | 5 Speed Transmission | A manual transmission with 5 forward gears. Gear shifter with pattern for 5 positions on shift knob. This has a clutch pedal in addition to the brake and gas pedals. |
| S6 | 6 Speed Transmission | A manual transmission with 6 forward gears. Gear shifter with pattern for 6 positions on shift knob. This has a clutch pedal in addition to the brake and gas pedals. |
| AF | Aftermarket Film Tint | Aftermarket tinted film on the passenger compartment windows of the vehicle. Note: If majority of the windows are OEM AS3 refer to Privacy Glass. |
| AC | Air Conditioning | A system of devices that causes a reduction or control of the temperature and humidity within the passenger compartment. Look for A/C selector on the dashboard. |
| TD | Alarm | The vehicle must have an audible alarm. This is not a panic button. This does not include the Passive Anti-Theft System. This does not include the etched serial number in the glass of the vehicle. |
| AW | Aluminum/Alloy Wheels | Wheel is made of aluminum/alloy. No removable components with the exception of lugs and/or the center cap. Note: If the diameter is 20" or greater refer to 20" or Larger Wheels. |
| AM | AM Radio | Audio equipment that receives AM signals. |
| A2 | Anti-lock Brakes (2) | A braking system that keeps the rear wheels from locking up during hard braking. Look for ABS light when turning the ignition on. ABS symbol might also be located on the console, brake pedal or dash of vehicle. 2-wheel ABS normally found on vans and pickups. |
| AB | Anti-lock Brakes (4) | A braking system that keeps the wheels from locking up during hard braking. Look for ABS light when turning the ignition on. ABS symbol might also be located on the console, brake pedal or dash of vehicle. |
| AT | Automatic Transmission | A mechanism of the drive train that has the ability to automatically shift gears for the driver. Appears as "D" on the gear shifter. Also includes CVT and DCT transmission types. |

| Option Code | Option Name | Option Definition |

| M3 | Auxiliary Audio Connection | Connects a portable audio unit such as an iPod or MP3 player to the vehicle's sound system. This connection allows music on the portable audio unit to be played over the vehicle's sound system. Newer models may have USB audio interface that is used for direct connections and/or Compact Flash/SD Cards. |
| XT | Auxiliary Fuel Tank | A fuel tank that is secondary to the primary and allows for greater fuel storage. Look for secondary fuel switch or gauge on instrument cluster. Note: There can be two separate fuel doors. This option is only found on pickups and UTVs. |
| PX | Backup Camera | Back up camera in the rear of the vehicle that assists in parking. A camera provides a live feed of the environment behind the vehicle to an LCD monitor inside the vehicle. Note: The monitor can be located in the rearview mirror or in the dash of the vehicle. |
| BL | Bed liner | A protective covering that attaches to and lines the inside of a truck bed. This is a snap in, removable bed liner or composite bed. Note: This does not include spray-on bed liner. (refer to Bed liner Spray On definition) |
| BY | Bed liner (Spray On) | A protective permanent covering that line the inside of the bed. Sprays into the bed instead of snapping or dropping into the truck bed. Refer to Bed Liner for composite beds. |
| AR | Bed Rails | Metal railings located on the top of the pickup bed with tie down capabilities. These can made of stainless steel, aluminum or black finished metal. |
| DV | Blind Spot Detection | An electronic system designed to alert the driver by continuously monitoring side areas with limited viewable angles. |
| BN | Body Side Moldings | A plastic or rubber attachment that runs along each side of the car. Look for rubber stripping on side of vehicle. Note: Body Cladding would not be considered Body Side Moldings. |
| BS | Bucket Seats | Appear as individual seats with a division between the two. Note: If the seats have 2 arm rests attached, refer to Captain's Chairs (2). |
| EM | California Emissions | Emission standards set by the state government in California to help reduce pollution. Vehicle owners are required to have their vehicles inspected by the DMV when renewing the vehicle's registration. If a vehicle does not meet the emissions standard, the vehicle owner would be unable to register the vehicle until they make repairs, and it passes. |
| B2 | Captain Chairs (2) | Independent chairs in the first row that have two armrests each. Note: Typically found on UTVs and/or vans. |
| B4 | Captain Chairs (4) | Independent chairs in the second row that have two armrests. Note: Driver/passenger seats may have one armrest and are included in the seat count. Typically found on UTVs and/or vans. |
| B6 | Captain Chairs (6) | Independent chairs in the second and third rows that have two armrests. Note: Driver/passenger seats may have one armrest and are included in the seat count. Typically found on UTVs and/or vans. |
| CA | Cassette | Audio equipment that plays cassette tapes. Look for tape player typically located in the dash. |
| SK | CD Changer/Stacker | A multiple disc CD player that is usually located in the dash, console or trunk. Note: If there is only the Changer present, the Option for CD should not be selected. However, a CD Changer and a single disc CD player are not mutually exclusive and both can be present on a vehicle. |
| CD | CD Player | Audio equipment that plays one compact disc. |
| CJ | Chrome Wheels | A premium wheel with chrome plating. Chrome can be highly reflective and has a mirror finish. |

| Option Code | Option Name | Option Definition |

| CY | Clad Wheels | A wheel that is made of aluminum/alloy or steel that has a plastic cover permanently attached. Note: If the diameter is 20" or greater, Refer to 20" or Larger Wheels |
| IP | Clear coat Paint | A clear coat paint covering used on modern vehicle bodies. It is the topcoat. Clear coat Paint was made standard on most vehicles 1981 and newer. |
| CL | Climate Control | A control on the dashboard which allows the driver and/or passenger to keep the temperature inside the vehicle at a certain level. Some vehicles have separate controls for both the driver and passenger to set their own preferred temperature. Climate control could be located in the front or rear of the vehicle with separate controls. Climate control can also be one universal temperature that is set for the entire car cabin and adjusts to the temperature controls as set by the driver. Climate control is for heat and cold. |
| CS | Cloth Seats | A majority of the seating surfaces are covered with cloth. Look for cloth on exterior of seat. |
| C2 | Communication System | A communication system that uses GPS and cellular technology to link the driver and a communication center. The communications center will provide a multitude of services to assist in safety and security for the driver. Note: Does not require an active subscription. |
| CN | Console/Storage | Permanent or removable storage compartment located between the driver and passenger seat. |
| CC | Cruise Control | A device that when set, controls the speed of the vehicle. Look for a selector typically located within the vicinity of the steering wheel or column. Note: This does not include Intelligent Cruise Control. |
| CP | Deluxe Truck Cap | A removable shell placed on the bed of a pickup. Most truck caps are considered deluxe. The truck cap will typically have windows and can be locked. Can be made of fiberglass or metal. Note: This is not to be confused with a Hard Tonneau Cover. |
| RM | Detachable Roof | A Detachable Roof is found on sports cars such as the Thunderbird or Miata. A detachable roof is one that does not fold, it lifts off. The body style for this option must be a convertible. Note: A Detachable Roof is not found on older SUVs such as Ford Bronco, Chevy Blazer and International Scout. That would be a Hard Top (HT). |
| AG | Driver's Side Air Bag | Driver side air bag that is installed in the steering column that inflates rapidly during select impacts. Look for SRS emblem on dash or steering wheel. |
| DA | Dual Air Conditioning | An air conditioning system that allows flow of cooled air to rear of vehicle. Must have separate controls for the front and rear temperature control. Note: This option is only available on Pickups, SUVs and Vans. |
| DM | Dual Mirrors | Side mirrors on each side of vehicle. Look for exterior mirrors on both driver's side and passenger's side doors. |
| DP | Dual Power Sliding Doors | Automatically controlled sliding side doors found on both sides of a van. Look for device on keychain that controls opening and closing of side doors. Look for power button on the driver side, on each sliding door, overhead console or the door pillar. |
| SD | Dual Power Sunroofs | A rooftop type where a portion of the roof is made of two sections of glass or steel and can be automatically retracted. Look for dual glass window on roof with controls immediately above front seats. Controls could also be located on the console between the driver and passenger seat. |
| WD | Dual Rear Wheels | Two rear wheels located on each side of axle that allows for greater payload. Look for trucks with a total of four rear wheels and only one axle. Note: This option is only available on pickups. |

| Option Code | Option Name | Option Definition |
|-------------|----------------------------|--|
| DU | Dual Screen Entertainment | Integrated system which includes, but not limited to a DVD/VCR with 2 or more flip-down viewing screens. The screens can typically be found within an overhead console or headrests of vehicle |
| EG | Electric Glass Roof | A rooftop type where a portion of the roof is made of glass and can be automatically retracted. Look for glass window on roof with controls immediately above front seats. Controls could also be located on the console between the driver and passenger seat. |
| ES | Electric Steel Roof | A rooftop type where a portion of the roof can be automatically retracted. Look for rectangular shaped cut-out on roof of vehicle. Look for steel on roof with controls immediately above front seats. Controls could also be located on the console between the driver and passenger seat. |
| EC | Entertainment Center | Integrated system which includes, but not limited to a DVD/VCR with one flip-down viewing screen. The screen can typically be found within an overhead console. Note: If there are 2 or more viewing screens, refer to Dual Screen Entertainment. |
| EQ | Equalizer | Audio equipment that is used to boost certain frequencies. Equalizer will have controls for bass, midrange and treble. |
| FR | Flip Roof | A glass roof that manually flips up and does not retract. |
| FM | FM Radio | Audio equipment that receives FM signals. |
| FL | Fog Lamps | Auxiliary lights on vehicle used in difficult driving conditions. Look for a second set of lights usually located directly below the main headlights. The control is usually found on or near the steering column or dash. |
| XG | Front Side Impact Air Bags | Air bags that inflate rapidly during a side impact collision protecting the shoulder area down to the seat. Look for airbag with hazard warning label. Note: These can also be found in the side pillar door or side of the seat. |
| GG | Grill Guards | A metal device that is designed to offer protection to the front grill of the vehicle. Look for metal cross guards in front of grille. The grill extends slightly in front of the vehicle's grill/lights to protect it from impact. |
| HF | Hands Free Device | Also known as Bluetooth, A permanently installed Hands Free or Voice Activated telephone device. This system may also control other digital devices such as iPods and Smart Phones. In the event that the vehicle also has an Auxiliary Audio Connection, that option should also be selected. |
| TZ | Hard Tonneau Cover | A flat bed cover made of fiberglass or other solid material. A hinged cover that could include a lock and/or a hydraulic lift. Note: This is only available on pickups. |
| HT | Hard Top | A component on a UTV (usually Jeeps) where a Hard-top roof can be placed on the vehicle to replace the soft top. |
| DG | Head/Curtain Air Bags | Air bags intended to reduce injuries in the case of a side impact or roll over. These typically rapidly deploy downward from the roof area or pillars, or on certain vehicles may deploy upward from the seat or door area (typically convertibles, some compacts). |
| HV | Headlamp Washers | A device that releases washer fluid and washes the headlamp. Note: Some vehicles will have wipers while others will not. |
| HU | Heads Up Display | A technology that displays images on the windshield to enable drivers to see information such as speed, collision avoidance, etc. |
| HM | Heated Mirrors | A defrost function for the side mirrors. |
| SH | Heated Seats | The interiors of the front seats contain a heating element to warm the cushions. Look for switches on console or seats. |

| Option Code | Option Name | Option Definition |

| HW | Heated Steering Wheel | A Steering Wheel that contains a heating element to warm the driver's hands. Look for switches on console or dash. |
| GD | Home Link | A universal remote control that can be programmed to control radio-controlled devices such as a garage door. This is typically located on the drivers visor or rear-view mirror. |
| IC | Intelligent Cruise | An enhanced speed control system that uses forward-looking radar to detect the speed and distance of the vehicle ahead. This device will automatically adapt and/or alert the driver if the vehicle becomes too close to the vehicle ahead. Note: Also, can be referred to as Adaptive Cruise Control. |
| IW | Intermittent Wipers | Windshield wipers that may be adjusted to pause and operate at variable speeds. Look for selector on the wiper arm. |
| KE | Keyless Entry | A system that allows the user to lock or unlock the doors of the vehicle without physically inserting the key into the lock. This may be a plastic key fob, keyless entry pad on the door or a chip within the key. |
| LN | Lane Departure Warning | An electronic system that monitors road or lane markings and alerts the driver of unintended lane changes. |
| LS | Leather Seats | A majority of the seating surfaces are covered with leather. This includes man-made and natural leather materials. Note: Vinyl seats are not included with this option. |
| KW | Locking Wheels | A specialized lug nut that requires a key or tool for wheel removal. |
| RR | Luggage/Roof Rack | A permanently mounted apparatus that may be used to carry additional equipment on the roof or trunk of the vehicle. This apparatus can run along the vertical or horizontal angles of the vehicle. You must be able to tie down the additional equipment. Look for metal or plastic device on roof or trunk of vehicle. This may or may not have crossbars. |
| MG | Manual Glass Roof | A rooftop type where a portion of the roof is made of glass and is manually retractable via a handle/crank. Look for glass in roof of vehicle with lift lever above front seats. |
| MS | Manual Steel Roof | A rooftop type where a portion of the roof is made of steel and is manually retractable via a handle/crank. Look for steel in roof of vehicle with lift lever above front seats. |
| MM | Memory Package | A package that may consist of memory seats and/or pedals, mirrors, steering wheel and radio. These functions allow the primary driver of the vehicle to preset their preferred settings on these options. At the push of a button, the seats and/or pedals, mirrors and steering wheel will electronically revert to the desired settings. Controls can typically be found on the driver side door. Note: The minimum requirement is a driver memory seat and one other memory component. In order to have a driver memory seat, Power Seat Option is also a minimum requirement. |
| MC | Message Center | An electronic instrumentation center located in the dash, overhead console, or center console that monitors several different systems and provides detailed vehicle information regarding items such as Miles per gallon, Miles to empty and Tire Pressure. |
| MP | Metallic Paint | Paint that contains metallic flakes which provide enhanced depth of the color. A paint which contains tiny dots of metal in its makeup to give it extra quality. |
| NV | Navigation System | The On-board Navigation System utilizes voice messages and optical aids to guide you to pre-selected destinations. With the latest On-board Monitor and Compact Disc or DVD containing digital mapping technology and data, you select a destination from listed entries, or directly from mapped destinations on the screen. Note: This option should not be used for portable aftermarket devices. |

| Option Code | Option Name | Option Definition |
|-------------|--------------------------|---|
| VZ | Night Vision | Technology that detects and alerts the driver of objects on the road beyond the reach of the car's headlights. May project an image on the driver's windshield of these objects. |
| OD | Overdrive | A transmission with a high gear that can reduce gas consumption. Look for OD on the gear shifter. |
| CO | Overhead Console | An overhead storage compartment usually located in between the driver and passenger seats. At minimum, a sunglasses holder and may also include storage for Kleenex, maps, controls, etc. Note: Any form of overhead storage. |
| PJ | Parking Sensors | Sensors in the vehicle that assist in parking by alerting the driver if the vehicle becomes too close to an object. The driver is alerted by a beeping sound. These sensors could be located in the front or rear of the vehicle. |
| RG | Passenger Air Bag | Passenger air bag installed in the dashboard that inflates rapidly during select impacts. Look for SRS emblem on passenger side dash. |
| PO | Positraction | A system that prevents drive wheels from spinning on slippery surfaces during acceleration. Note: Also known as Limited Slip Differential. |
| PP | Power Adjustable Pedals | An electric device that controls the movement of the pedals. The driver may automatically move the pedals to accommodate his/her height. |
| PB | Power Brakes | A hydraulic braking system that uses engine vacuum to assist driver when braking. |
| VP | Power Convertible Roof | An automobile without a fixed roof. The roof automatically folds up so that the passenger compartment is exposed to the air. Look for cloth top with power retracting mechanisms in the interior. |
| SP | Power Driver Seat | An electronic device that controls the movement of the driver's seat; forward, backward, upward, and downward. Look for selector on side of driver's seat, driver's side door, or proximity of center console. Note: Lumbar support or power recline available as stand-alone would not be considered a Power Driver Seat. |
| PL | Power Locks | Door locks that may be controlled automatically by driver and passenger. Look for button devices on armrest of door or on center console. |
| PM | Power Mirrors | Side mirrors that are controlled from the driver compartment. Look for mirror selector with direction arrows on dashboard or on the driver's door. |
| PC | Power Passenger Seat | An electronic device that controls the movement of the passenger's seat; forward, backward, upward, and downward. Look for selector on side of passenger's seat, passenger's side door, or proximity of center console. Note: Lumbar support or power recline available as stand alone would not be considered a Power Passenger Seat. The seat needs to move in all four directions. |
| PG | Power Rear Window | A window found on trucks that is located in rear of the cab. This window can be electronically opened and closed by the driver of the vehicle. |
| PD | Power Sliding Door | A single automatically controlled side door found on vans that slides open or closed. Look for device on keychain that controls opening and closing of side door. There could be a button on the sliding door or in the overhead console. |
| PS | Power Steering | A steering system that uses hydraulic pressure to increase the drivers turning ability. Actually decreases steering effort. |
| 3P | Power Third Seat | A power device that controls the movement of the bench seat in the rear of the station wagon, van, or UTV. Can be power reclining, power fold up or power down. |
| PT | Power Trunk/Gate Release | A system that opens the trunk/liftgate of the vehicle. This may be controlled either by remote control or in the passenger compartment. |

| Option Code | Option Name | Option Definition |
|-------------|--------------------------------|--|
| PW | Power Windows | Windows that may be automatically controlled up or down by driver and passengers. Look for button devices to depress on armrest of door or in proximity of the center console. |
| UR | Premium Radio | An upgraded sound system, either factory or aftermarket. A factory premium radio often includes brand name badging (Examples include Bose, and Harmon Kardon). An after-market premium radio has to have upgraded head unit and speakers to be considered as part of Premium Radio. Note: Is Satellite Radio is present, refer to Satellite Radio. |
| DT | Privacy Glass | Glass that has a dark tint and hinders the view of the passenger compartment of the vehicle. This option includes OEM glass code of AS-3. Note: If the majority glass has an aftermarket film installed, refer to Aftermarket Film Tint. |
| UP | Pwr Retractable Running Boards | An electronically controlled railing located on the underside of a Pickup/Van/UTV's doors that assists with ease of entry into the vehicle. These can be automatically drawn underneath the vehicle when the door is opened and closed. |
| RD | Rear Defogger | An electric heating device built into the rear window that is used to remove ice from the window. Look for lines running across rear window. |
| RH | Rear Heated Seats | The interiors of the rear seats contain a heating element to warm the cushions. Look for switches on console or dash. |
| SZ | Rear Power Sunshade | A motorized rear sunshade that will raise a shield to protect the interior compartment and passengers from direct sunlight. |
| ZG | Rear Side Impact Air Bags | Air bags installed in the rear doors that inflate rapidly during a side impact collision protecting the shoulder area down to the seat. Look for airbag with hazard warning label. Note: These can also be found in the side pillar door or side of the seat. |
| SW | Rear Sliding Window | A manual sliding window found on trucks that is located in rear of the cab with locking lever. |
| SL | Rear Spoiler | An aerodynamic device attached to a vehicle. Look for wing shaped device on deck lid or tailgate of vehicle. Spoilers can be found on Trucks, UTVs and Vans. |
| SB | Rear Step Bumper | A bumper on the rear of vehicle that can act as a step for easier access into the rear of the vehicle. Step bumpers will have some type of traction, protective, or skid padding or anti-skids. Note: This is not available as an option on cars. |
| WP | Rear Window Wiper | A single wiper located on the rear windshield. |
| RL | Reclining/Lounge Seats | A seat type where the back portion is adjustable and may be reclined backwards. Look for lever on side of seat. |
| RJ | Remote Starter | A remote-control system that allows the user to start the vehicle without having to physically get in the vehicle and use the key. Popular in colder climates, where the user can start the vehicle without having to brave the elements. |
| R3 | Retractable Seats | Rear Seats that stow away to provide more cargo room by completely storing into the floor of the vehicle. If the 3rd row seats are Power, refer to Power Third Seat. |
| RB | Rollbar | A metal apparatus located behind/within the cab of the vehicle that in case of rollover protects the driver and passenger compartment. Look for metal bar behind cab of vehicle. Note: This could commonly be found on Jeep Wranglers, Suzuki Sidekicks. This is also considered rollover protection in convertibles. |
| BD | Running Boards/Side Steps | A railing or step located on the underside of a Pickup/Van/UTV's door's that assists with ease of entry into the vehicle. Note: If powered, refer to power retractable running boards. |

| Option Code | Option Name | Option Definition |
|-------------|-------------------------------|--|
| XM | Satellite Radio | Digital radio signal that is broadcast by communication satellite, which effectively allows the user to pick up radio stations from around the country instead of just within their region. This includes the radio equipment and antenna. Note: Does not require an active subscription. Radios with only Satellite Prep or Satellite Ready do not qualify. |
| SE | Search/Seek | A feature on radio that allows user to sequentially scan for radio stations. |
| MX | Signal Integrated Mirrors | Turn signals that are integrated into the side mirrors of the vehicle. A flashing arrow or light appears on the mirror indicating the intended direction of the turn. This can be located within the glass or frame of the mirror. |
| OR | Skyview Roof | A fixed glass panel, or an open roof area, over multiple rows of seats. Note: In the instance that the vehicle has a combination of fixed and open roof sections, then both the skyview roof and electric glass roof should be selected. |
| TN | Soft Tonneau Cover | A bed cover made of cloth, vinyl, or any other type of fabric. Note: This option is only available on pickups. |
| T1 | Stability Control | Stability Control is a technology that assists the driver in maintaining control of the vehicle. The system compares the driver's intended direction to the vehicle's actual direction. If the driver goes right and the car does not follow, then this technology brakes individual front or rear wheels and/or reduces excess engine power. |
| TQ | Steering Wheel Touch Controls | Controls located on the steering wheel that generally control the radio. Note: This has to include radio controls. When only cruise control buttons are located on the steering wheel, this would not be considered Steering Wheel Touch Controls. |
| ST | Stereo | Audio equipment that receives AM/FM signals and amplifies sound to speakers. Look for radio in dash of vehicle. |
| SG | Stone Guard | Chip resistant coating to protect the vehicle's finish from chipping. |
| SY | Styled Steel Wheels | A styled wheel with little trim. Often a standard wheel on base level trucks. |
| PZ | Surround View Camera | A camera system that provides a live 360 Degree view of the vehicles surroundings. An LCD monitor inside the vehicle will display objects surrounding the vehicle. |
| TL | Telescopic Wheel | A steering column that can be shortened or lengthened to provide the most comfortable driving position. Look for steering wheel that can be moved inwards or outwards. Note: Typically, the button is located in close proximity to the tilt wheel lever or button. |
| HP | Three Stage Paint | A three-layer paint system that usually includes a base, pearl and clear coat paint. Note: An example is White Diamond paint. |
| TW | Tilt Wheel | A steering wheel that can be moved up and down. |
| TG | Tinted Glass | Glass that has a light tint and does let others view inside the passenger compartment of the vehicle. Note: This would include light grey and/or amber light tinted glass. |
| TB | Toolbox (Permanent) | A box affixed to the pickup bed of the vehicle that is used to store tools. Look for an attached box in rear of bed. Box could be located at the front or sides of the truck bed. |
| TX | Traction Control | A system that helps to prevent wheel spin on slippery surfaces during acceleration. Look for traction control button on dash, underneath transmission selector, or underneath radio of vehicle. |
| TH | Trailer Hitch | A frame or bumper mounted receiver hitch that may be OEM or Aftermarket. Note: Refer to Trailering Package when Integrated wiring is also present. |
| TP | Trailering Package | A frame or bumper mounted receiver hitch with integrated wiring. Trailer hitch and/or wiring may be either OEM or aftermarket. Note: This option requires and automatically selects the Trailer Hitch option. |

| Option Code | Option Name | Option Definition |

| TT | T-TOP/PANEL | A removable roof panel(s) which may or may not be separated by a metal bar in the middle of the roof. This will not be used on a convertible. |
| 2T | Two Tone Paint | A paint style which consists of two shades of one color (i.e. Dark Blue and Light Blue) or two separate colors. Note: This does not include body cladding that is a different color. |
| VB | Ventilated Seats | The interiors of the seats contain a ventilation or cooling system to cool the cushions. Look for switches on console or seats. |
| VR | Vinyl Covered Roof | A vinyl covering for an automobile's roof area. A full or partial vinyl covering on the automobile's roof. |
| FC | Wheel Covers | A removable wheel cover that covers at least a portion of the wheel. Also known as a Hubcap. Note: If the wheel cover is a wire spoke design, refer to Wire Wheel Covers. |
| WI | Winch | A power device employing a drum with cable used for pulling objects. |
| WC | Wire Wheel Covers | A wire spoke designed hubcap that covers the rim portion of the wheel. |
| WW | Wire Wheels | Premium wheels of wire spoke design. This is not a wire wheel cover. Note: If the diameter is 20" or greater, refer to 20" or Larger Wheels. |
| WT | Wood Interior Trim | An interior design that provides a look of finished wood. Look for wood-like finish on dash, door, or other interior trim panels. Note: This can also include real wood interior. |
| WG | Woodgrain | An exterior finish that provides the appearance wood. |
| XE | Xenon or LED Headlamps | High Intensity Discharge lights, L.E.D. or Xenon lights that produce a much brighter light than a halogen light. |
